






Short story of the museum

- •Founded in 1748 with the collection of naval and arsenal machinery models by Louis Henri Duhamel du Monceau General inspector in the french Navy.
- First located in Louvre.
- Closed during the french revolution.
- Reopened in 1827 by the king Charles X.
- Moving to the palais de Chaillot in 1943.
- •since 1971 public establishement under the tutelage of the ministry of defense and ministry of culture. This organisation includes The main museum in Paris and five satellite museums located in the provinces

AAMM's modeling Philosophy

Deeply investigate « arsenal » and didactic modeling

When you spend 2/3 000 hours building a model, it does not cost more to do the job the most accurately as you can. Be strict on the sources, use the most performing tools,

It does not cost much time to extend the modeling as a way to restore the maritime story and the constitution of a ship.

If you develop a new technic don't keep it for yourself only, but teach it to other members

The aim of the modelers inside AAMM

To respond the demand from the MnM

In 2009 a rope factory model was offered to the Toulon satellite establishement In 2010/11 a model of a tide gate used in the dock at Rochefort arsenal has been completed In 2011/12 a project concerns the building of two models of the cruiser *Foudre*

- To restore private model on request
- To help the modelers from everywhere to built acurate models.
- To provide the modelers with referenced monographies
- To advise the enthousiasts, using the correct sources of the MnM and proper method.

Conferences are proposed at the MnM each Monday on a subject generally related to modeling. Private display of the models in progress, every three months

Modelers main activity

90% is devoted to scratch building using existing monography

7% build a scratch model using original historic document*

3% have a speciality as model in a bottle, ivory or bein model, figurehead, diorama

Less than 1% build or improve an existing commercial kit







Most of the inshore craft were built without any design only by experience of shipwright tranmitted from generation to generation. The Adm. Pâris drawings are the only way to know how they were built and used

Model of a Sacoleva using drawing of adm. Pâris











Boat of Kobé 1868

technique

Type: Building on frame (95% of the models)

Rough material: Box and pear tree, ebony (old sailing ships), plywood, aluminium, brass, plastic, cardboard sheet (« grey » ships)

Tools: Lathe, milling machine, elec. Saw, DAO/CAO, photo cutting out,

Scale :1/18 to 1/48 for sailing ships 1/72 to 1/100 for « grey » ships

technique


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Special tool to manufacture the blocks by Gérard Chenivesse
