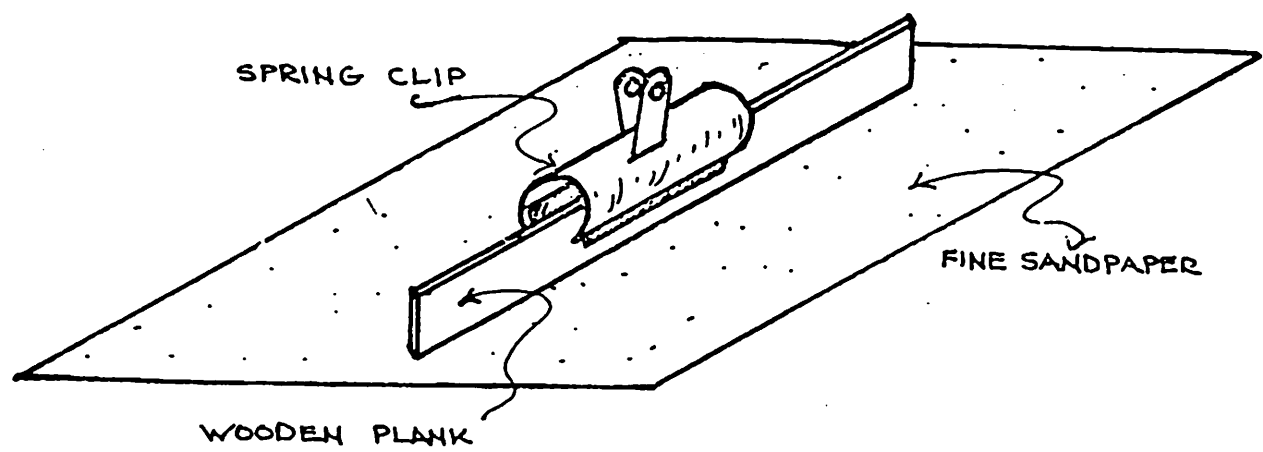

- 5 SHAPE EXTERNAL LINE OF *T-H FLUGH W/ HULL CONTOUR.
- 6 MARK EXTERNAL DECK SHEAR ON HULL & INSERT KNIFE @ LINE TO BEGIN REMOVAL OF BULWARK.
- 7 REPEAT UNDER CUT W/ KNIFE & CHISEL FROM INSIDE @ DECK.
- 8 REMOVE ALL UNWANTED BULWARK & YOU HAVE EXPOSED TIMBER-HEADS READY FOR WATERWAYS & PLANKING. PLANK-PLANK-PLANK-PLANK



Tired of sanding your fingers ??? Try this:---

A spring paper clip can be a handy little tool for holding small thin wooden planks and beams during finish sanding and beveling operations. Hold the item in the clamp while rubbing it over fine sandpaper placed on a flat surface. You will have complete control without giving an unwanted manicure! I use clips that are one, two and one half, and three inches long for different jobs.
