Friends,

In past conferences, we provided attendees with printed presentation notes in a ring binder. These were a lot of work and expense in the past, so we chose to avoid them this time. If we can post WSMC&E presentations on the SMA site, it might be a reasonable compromise. As I mentioned to some of you during the conference, I'd like to explore the possibility of capturing your WSMC&E presentations on the SMA web site.

The web site has a Research Room where we are trying to build a home for useful information about ship modeling techniques that doesn't always have a home elsewhere. You can check-out the Research Room here (<http://shipmodelersassociation.org/research.html>). The Research Room supports keyword searching, and we can arrange for all of posted presentations to be found by a single search key (probably "WSMC&E"), by your name, and by relevant keywords.

I know that some of you may have copyright or other client/employer information issues that would need to be considered before we might post your presentation. I am not interested in creating problems for any of you with this idea, so if you think may have these sorts of problems (or if you simply don't want to post your presentation) please let me know. I won't post anything until I have your permission to do so in an email. If small edits (like deleting a slide or two) can make your presentation presentable, we can easily accommodate these as well. We can also restrict availability of your presentation to current SMA members only, if you'd like.
